Your support also enabled the Foundation to provide free shipping on a wide range of public outreach resources ordered through the AALAS Bookstore. This important initiative provides AALAS members with the tools they need to conduct successful public outreach programs in their community. 2010 Projects and Programs

The AALAS Foundation contributes to the public's awareness of ethical issues in the use of animals and the advances made that help both animals and people. The Foundation is engaged in an ongoing educational effort, with particular emphasis on schools, to inform the public about the knowledge gained through the responsible use of animals in research.

School Resources Library

The School Resources Library on the AALAS Learning Library houses free educational materials tailored for middle school and high school students.

The Library features an online version of Frogs: A Comprehensive Course for High School Students. The course teaches high school students about the biology, physiological adaptations, anatomy, evolution, and ecology of frog and toad species in the United States.

Other School Resources Library titles include Careers for Laboratory Animal Veterinarians and Careers for Laboratory Animal Technicians.

Whyville


The AALAS Foundation's Community Animal Research Environment (CARE) in Whyville generated 793,984 games played in 2010.

CARE is a series of games in a virtual laboratory that teach future leaders about the essential role of animals in biomedical research.

Registered Whyville users can create habitats for animals, experience the role of an animal caregiver, and discover how

animal research generated cures and treatments for illnesses impacting humans and animals.

In 2010, 21,999 Whyville visitors viewed online brochures located inside CARE. These bro-

Outreach at Teacher Conferences

AALAS staff exhibited at the annual meetings of the National Science Teachers Association (NSTA), National Association for Biology Teachers (NABT), Future Farmers of America (FFA), and National Education Association (NEA) to provide teachers and students with outreach resources highlighting the essential role of animals in research.

Free Outreach Resources

With the generous support of our donors, the AALAS Foundation now offers complimentary shipping on AALAS Bookstore (aalas.org/bookstore) orders comprised exclusively of Foundation public outreach materials.

AALAS and the AALAS Foundation, with the assistance

of Pfizer, also offers complimentary Animal Research Education and Awareness Program resources to branches and member institutions interested in conducting the program in their communities.

AREA Program resources include a step-by-step event guide, logoed backpacks, student notebooks and pens, and Foundation outreach materials.

Coming Soon!

Foundation volunteers and staff are working to implement the following public outreach projects in 2011:

Expand School Resources Library

The Foundation is expanding its arsenal of online learning resources aimed at students and teachers.

New courses planned for the School Resources Library include Introduction to Laboratory Animal Science and an online version of the Caring for Animals in the Classroom book.

Our long-term goal is to utilize these courses—and other ALL resources—to provide teachers with informative courses they can use to enhance their biology curriculum.

Launch Public Outreach Campaign

In conjunction with AALAS, the Foundation is planning a public outreach campaign designed to highlight the compassionate, caring professionals who've chosen a career in laboratory animal science. The multifaceted campaign will feature written, audio, and video profiles of AALAS members and detail the importance of quality laboratory animal care and research.

Develop New Public Outreach Brochures

The Foundation is crafting two new series of brochures one highlighting medical discoveries made possible through animal research and another stressing the importance of product safety testing.

Revamp Kids 4 Research Website

The Foundation is planning to update and launch a new version of the popular Kids 4 Research website next year. The site includes age-appropriate information on topics such as animal welfare, the biomedical research process, and careers in laboratory animal science. Planned improvements to the site include a fresh look, improved content, and more interactive features that appeal to young people.
